#### What to Bring

To help us best understand your space and your vision, we recommend bringing:

- A floor plan or room measurements
- Photos or digital inspiration (Pinterest, Houzz, etc.)
- Magazine clippings or bookmarked design features
- Cabinet and countertop samples (if already selected)

If you don't have all these items, that's okay—bring what you can, and we'll guide you through the rest.

### Recommended Order of Selections

Based on years of experience, we recommend making your design selections in the following order to ensure a smooth, cohesive project:

1. **Cabinetry** – Choose the door style, design details, and finish.
2. **Countertops** – Select material and color to complement your cabinets.
3. **Tile** – Determine color, size(s), layout, and accent pieces.
4. **Fixtures** – Confirm the style and finish for plumbing and lighting.
5. **Paint** – Choose colors for walls and trim last.

#### Why this order matters:

Starting with elements that are more permanent and harder to change (like cabinetry and countertops) ensures greater flexibility and design cohesion. For example, choosing paint first may limit future design options, as paint is easier to match fixed materials than vice versa.
